Foundation for International Studies

Created by Public Deed in 1986, the Foundation for International Studies, at the University of Malta, Valletta, has the responsibility of promoting and initiating, at the international level, research, information and training activities related primarily to Mediterranean and ocean affairs and to environmental concerns. The Foundation also assists the University of Malta, with which it is associated, in its international affairs.

Through funds derived from the Government of Malta as well as through assignments given to it by international bodies, notably UNESCO and the Council of Europe, the Foundation organizes international conferences, seminars and workshops throughout the year. Run by a Board of Trustees and advised by a Planning Council composed of eminent persons from Malta and overseas, the Foundation takes a leading role in international initiatives such as the Rights of Future Generations to their Environment and on issues relating to the Common Heritage of Mankind.

Established in May 1986 as an affiliate institution of the Foundation for International Studies, the Institute promotes Mediterranean studies in both the arts and social sciences. An attempt is made at promoting a holistic understanding of this historic region, its culture and its people.

The Institute performs three important functions: training, research and information, through the organization of interdisciplinary courses, the promotion of networking, conferences and publications.

Currently, the programmes of the Mediterranean Institute include: Music, Archaeology, the Mediterranean Social Sciences Network, Peace Education, Theatre, Cinema and Television, Cultural Tourism, Human Rights, Marine Affairs and Mediterranean Island Cultures.
